1.1 Enquiries

Please note that all requests regarding technical queries, rule clarification or regarding an incident at an event must be in writing by the competitor or entrant; in the case of competitors under the age of 18 requests will be accepted by the parent.

3. General Information

3.1 Guardians

All competitors under the age of 18 must be accompanied by their parent. If a parent is not attending the event, then a nominated Guardian must be present. A parent of an under aged competitor must inform the MA Event Manager – richard.millott@ma.org.au of the guardian's name and contact details prior to the event.

3.2 Rider Numbers

Competitors must apply for a Rider Number by completing the ProMX Rider Number Application on the Competitor Info Section of www.auspromx.com.au. Existing allocations are available on the Competitor Info Section of www.auspromx.com.au.

3.3 On Board Cameras

No Helmet camera are allowed.

3.4 Web Links

Information is posted and communicated as soon as it becomes available. If the information you are seeking is not yet posted, then it is probably not yet available.

3.5 Withdrawals – Refund Policy

For the withdrawal of an entry to be valid it must be made at least 10 working days prior to the first day of the round in question. A withdrawal under this criteria will receive a refund, however \$20 of the entry fee will be withheld for administrative costs and all credit card and processing fees will not be refunded.

If you withdraw within 10 working days of the first day of a round, this needs to be completed in writing and accompanied by a medical certificate. A refund will be granted once this is received and \$20 of the entry fee will be withheld for administrative costs and all credit card and processing fees will not be refunded.

3.6 Ridernet Profiles

It is the responsibility of the competitor to ensure their Ridernet profile is up to date and accurate. It is advised to add your bikes including VIN and Engine Number at the start of the year, this information is then stored in your profile and can be applied to each event. Competitors without a VIN and/or Engine Number on their entry may result in delays/refusal from Technical Inspection.

5.3 Licencing

ProMX will be conducted under MA Permits and is open to competitors holding a current MA Senior National Licence, an endorsed MA Junior National Licence, or an FIM Licence.

An International Meeting Number (IMN) will be issued if required for International riders holding an FIM Licence and they will require a valid Start Permission from their Federation.

Non-Australian citizens or Non-permanent residents of Australia are not eligible for a One Event Competition Licence. A One Event Competition Licence is subject to the conditions outlined in the Licencing and Conditions Document available at www.ma.org.au

6.2 Timing

6.2.1 Transponder Rental

Riders without transponders may hire them for a fee of \$15.00 per bike – payable at time of entry.

If a rider requires a transponder that has not been paid for with the entry (for example where they failed to bring or charge their own transponder), a fee of \$20.00 payable via EFTPOS on the day will be required.

Riders will be required to have their own transponder mounting bracket which can be mounted permanently on their bike. These can be purchased at the event at a cost of \$10.00 – EFTPOS only.

The competitor who fails to return the transponder within 2 weeks of the conclusion of an event will incur replacement costs and may result in suspension of the competitor's MA license.

6.3 Tickets and Car Park Passes

6.3.1 Tickets

Tickets are required from the first morning of competition; some events may differ with confirmation advised via the Final Instructions. Competitors found to not have their tickets at the gate will be required to purchase new tickets. Children 12 and under are free.

Series Competitors – Competitors that enter every round of the series and are eligible to apply for a series hard card. Riders and their teams will be required to complete a survey at the beginning of the series. Riders will receive these at Round 1 and will be able to use these to gain access to each round of the championship. Hard card passes will not be issued after Round 2.

Round by Round Competitors – If you are not a series competitor, passes will be emailed to the riders in the week leading up to event, to access these passes riders will be required to complete a survey via survey monkey upon event entry.

Additional passes – These can be purchased at a special family and friends discount rate via Ticketebo prior to the event.

Should riders not follow this process and arrive at the Event without a valid pass, they will have to purchase all passes at the gate with no discounts allowed with no exceptions

6.4 Competitor Parking

Competitors will be advised of competitor parking times within the Final Instructions.

No camping or early setup will be permitted. If you arrive early to set up without permission, you may be asked to leave the venue.

6.5 Entry Closing Dates

Entries must be received by MA before 11:59pm on the dates listed in the "Closing Date" table below.

Late entries, which will be considered at the discretion of ProMX Event Management, will incur a late fee of **\$50.00**, competitors will not be listed in the event program and preferred garage allocation will not be available.

7. Numberplate Decals

It is a condition of entry that each bike in the championship must run the series Penrite ProMX logo header on the front number plate. MA will provide the art design for the header of the front number plate via the series website. For one-off round competitors, there will be a sticker available at Race Admin.

8. Points Scoring

8.1 Points Scoring

As per GCRs Points will be as follows, 1st 25, 2nd 22, 3rd 20, 4th 18, 5th 16, 6th to 20th will be 15 points decreasing 1 point with each position down to 20th.

If points are tied for any position in a Competition which is conducted over more than one leg, the tying competitor who has the higher finishing position in the final leg of the Competition will be awarded the position.

If points are tied for any position in a Series, the tying competitor who has the greatest number of higher placings in the Series will be awarded the position.

8.2 ProMX Prize Money

Prize Money will be awarded each round based on the overall classification for the round. Any prize money not invoiced or claimed within 30 days may be forfeited.
